Content

Participants will increase awareness of their current leadership style, learn fundamental leadership concepts and skills, establish goals for the duration of the Intensive, and receive on-going support as they apply new approaches in their organization.

Each participant will customize their experience through personal goals, scenarios from their own experience, individual coaching sessions, and application of tools relevant to their agencies.

Format

The Intensive is designed to provide a challenging yet supportive development experience for leaders in public safety. The program is very much "hands on" and practical. The extended duration provides continuity, supports "experimentation" in the workplace, and solidifies progress.

Format: Two-month program with up to 14 public safety leaders in a closed group.

Assessment: Myers Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI); Conflict Mode Instrument (TKI); and 360° Feedback (up to 25 individuals provide feedback

on over 50 dimensions of participant's leadership).

Workshops: Five high-participation sessions focusing on key leadership concepts, practical tools, and case studies.

October 11; October 25; November 8; November 29; December 20 (all 8:30am-1pm).

Location: Jackson County Sheriff's Office (Training Room), 5179 Crater Lake Highway, Central Point, Oregon Complementary gourmet coffee, tea, juices & fresh-baked goods, graduation luncheon following Dec 20 workshop.

Coaching: Four hours individual Coaching with Guy Perrin (in person and/or by email, Skype, Facetime or telephone).

Resources: Library of leadership books and CDs, and practical workbook.

Credit: Form F-6 will be available to log hours, and will be submitted to DPSST. All participants receive framed certificate upon completion.

Who Should Attend

The Intensive is for public safety leaders from agencies in Southern Oregon. Both experienced leaders and those new to their role will benefit from the program. Participants must be in a leadership position and have the support of their command staff to develop "best practice" skills.
